

Just a few minutes of your time spent reading carefully through these instructions will assure your obtaining optimum performance that will bring you continued enjoyment for many years.






ELECTRIC CLOCK OPERATION

■ Plug the receiver's power cord into an AC electrical outlet (60 Hz, 110~120V), so your instrument is functioning as an electric clock. The Time Indicator will light up and the red mark in the Clock Indicator will start to move.

YOUR SOLID STATE CLOCK RADIO MUST BE POWERED FROM AN AC LINE ONLY NEVER CONNECT TO DC!

■ Time Set Control...Turn downwards to set the Time Indicator to the correct time. As this clock is 24-hour system, make sure that the letter (AM or PM) on the Time Indicator is correct.

RADIO OPERATION

- Clock Selector Control...Controls power to the radio when the Sleep Control is at "O". Turn to "ON" position and your radio is ready to play.
- Volume Control...Adjust to the desired sound level.
- Band Selector...Use this selector to choose the desired radio broadcast band, FM or AM. In the "FM" or "FM AFC" position, the FM Dial will light up, and in the "AM" position, the AM Dial will light up.

For FM reception, keep this selector in "FM" position while tuning. After the FM station is properly tuned in, turn this selector to the "FM AFC" position to assure drift-free listening.

- Tuning Control...Tune to your favorite station on FM (87~108MHz) or AM (525~1605kHz).
- Tone Control...Adjust this control to obtain the desired bass-treble quality.

ANTENNAS

This radio incorporates a sensitive built-in ferrite core antenna to assure excellent AM reception.


To improve reception of weak stations, re-position your radio cabinet until the loudest signal is attained.

■ This radio incorporates a built-in FM power cord antenna, which has been connected at the factory for your convenience. Stretch out the power cord completely and change the direction of the power cord until optimum FM reception is obtained.

OPERATION AS A MUSICAL WAKE-UP ALARM

Your radio can be adjusted to turn on automatically.



- Turn the Alarm Set Control upwards to set the Alarm Dial to the desired "wake-up" time. As the Alarm Dial is 24-hour system, make sure that the letter (AM or PM) on the Alarm Dial is correct.
- Preset the Clock Selector Control to "AUTO" position if you wish to awaken to the radio; preset to "ALARM" position if you wish to awaken to the buzzer alarm only.

Note: The radio (or buzzer) will be shut off automatically after about 100 minutes. Once you set the radio (or buzzer) to desired time, radio (or buzzer) will be on everyday at same hour, so it is not necessary to preset day after day.

When you desire to turn off the radio (or buzzer) before it automatically shut off after about 100 minutes, turn the Clock Selector Control to "OFF" position.

OPERATION AS A GO-TO-SLEEP RADIO

Your radio can be adjusted to play and then turn off automatically after a preset interval up to 60 minutes.

- Adjust the Sleep Control to the period of time the radio is to play by moving the Sleep Control to any point between "O" and "60". If you set the Sleep Control to "30", the radio will automatically turn itself off after playing for about 30 minutes.
- Turn the Clock Selector Control to "OFF" position. (The Sleep Control now controls the power to the radio.)

OPERATION AS A COMBINATION GO-TO-SLEEP/MUSICAL WAKE-UP ALARM



Your radio can be adjusted to turn off automatically after a preset interval up to 60 minutes, and then turn on again at wake-up time.

- Preset the Sleep Control to a value between "0" and "60".
- Set the Alarm Dial to the desired "wake-up" time.
- Preset the Clock Selector Control to "AUTO" or "ALARM" position as desired.

FOR PRIVATE LISTENING

Connect the provided earphone or pillow speaker (available as an optional accessory model RD-9201 from your PANASONIC dealer) to the Earphone Jack.

The speaker in the radio is automatically disconnected when the plug is inserted.

Thanks to unique "sure-awake" alarm system, even if you have used the earphone or pillow speaker at night before radio shuts off automatically, you can be awakened to music direct from the speaker of the radio in the morning.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Keep radio away from heating appliances, and electrical noise generating devices such as fluorescent lamps and motors.
- The radio should not be directly exposed to sunlight, and should be kept free from dust, moisture and vibration.
- The cabinet of your radio should be given the care which you would afford to any piece of fine furniture. However, the top and front side should be cleaned with a soft cloth moistened with a mild soap and water solution. NEVER USE A SOLUTION CONTAINING BENZOL OR PETROLEUM.
